#### **Instructional DVD Series Now Available**

Macomb library patrons can now access some of the finest instructors in a variety of disciplines right from their homes. Recently, the Friends of the Macomb Public Library purchased seven new courses on DVD from The Teaching Company. The courses are part of "The Great Courses: Teaching that Engages the Mind" published by The Teaching Company and featuring lectures by renowned teachers in their field.

One course, "The Joy of Mathematics" was purchased by an anonymous donor in memory of Joe Stipanowich. Stipanowich was the former Western Illinois University mathematics chair and longtime mathematics faculty member. Other courses include: How the Earth Works, Broadway Musicals, Anatomy and Physiology, Dutch Masters, Foundation of Western Civilization, and Zero to Infinity. The DVD courses are available for check-out at the public library.
